The Planning for College program has engaged **415** submissions.



Kids' Chance History

Robert Clyatt, a workers' compensation attorney from Valdosta, Georgia, founded the first Kids' Chance organization in 1988. In 2007, the national organization, Kids' Chance of America, was formed to create, assist and support organizations throughout the United States with this simple purpose: raise money to provide scholarships for the children of workers seriously injured or killed on the job.
