## **B.** Project Purpose

The purpose of the Labor-Management Advisory Council (LMAC) on Workers' Compensation is to provide a structure for an organized discussion of workers' compensation public policy with the objective of bringing forward ideas, improvements and recommending changes that will have a positive impact on Montana's workers' compensation system. The LMAC will share ideas, gather information, furnish advice, and make recommendations on workers' compensation and safety issues to the commissioner in order to facilitate education among stakeholders, promote mutual cooperation between labor and management and improve the workers' compensation system.
