



State Plan OSHA Summary

- Funding
 - Federal plan is paid for 100% by the Federal Government
 - State plan has Federal grant money available
 - State plan must lobby for the grant money
- Fines
 - Federal all fine money is paid to the Federal Government
 - State plan all fine money is paid to State
 - State decides where the money goes
- Litigation
 - Appeals are made at the regional office (Denver)
 - Appeals are made to the State
- Data
 - Federal plan Injury data from the whole country is used
 - State plan can use their own data some states have access to their FROI as Montana does they are able to use this data to guide their program
- Emphasis programs
 - Federal plan selected using Federal data
 - State plan selected using state data, some states use WC data
- Catastrophic Injuries
 - Federal plan looks at accidents involving hospitalizations of 3 or more workers
 - State plan can reduce that to 1 employee
- 1st step
 - Form a group to conduct compliance of State, County and City workers
 - Commissioner Bucy and Administrator Ferriter have given permission to form a new section for this purpose
- Last step
 - There is a final approval step
 - Many States have chosen not to complete it
- State Effort = State Control
 - In general the more effort we put in to this the more control we can have
- State Plan Board
 - There is a board of States plan States
 - Diana has agreed to bring in members from 2 other State plans to speak
