
- Met Billy in hospital and casted left arm

 - Technology changes



Road to Recovery


Road to Recovery

- Collaboration with Billy's care team to establish and progress toward recovery:
 - Communication with MD re: medical POC, precautions, and prescription
 - Communication with case management team re: POC
 - Communication with occupational and physical therapy re: prosthesis design and function



Road to Recovery


- Early and ongoing involvement in occupational and physical therapy:
 - Independence in ADLs/reduced need for assistance
 - Return to employment early
 - Balance and core strength
 - Education and prevention of overuse conditions

Prosthetic Requirements

Prosthetic Requirements

- Early preparatory fitting
 - Provides path to ADL independence rapidly
 - Helps determine prosthetic devices needed as more independence is gained
- Maintenance, adjustments and repairs
- Equipment and technology changes
- Coordinate with OT and PT services
 - Train use of prosthesis, including technology changes
 - Prevent and remediate overuse conditions


